Both requested to visit Glengowan following our improvements in the teaching of Reading and Writing. A group of Primary 7 children delivered a presentation on our 'Writing Revolution' and answered questions about literacy learning at the school. Four of our teachers taught lessons to their classes in front of our guests and Mrs Field & Mr Urquhart gave a short presentation on how learners receive additional support when needed. I had an opportunity to explain our improvement journey, which was made possible by our staff's commitment to professional learning and how this has led to higher-quality teaching.
