Sharing good practice

I was able to deliver a presentation at the University of Glasgow earlier this month. Following this, student teachers were invited to Glengowan to learn more about Systematic Synthetic Phonics (SSP). 17 students volunteered to visit the school, take part in training, observe lessons and then commit to working with groups of children in the coming months. All of this is in addition to their core initial teacher education. It is hoped that these student teachers will have increased knowledge about supporting children with reading difficulties as they begin their careers. It is commendable that they have chosen to participate in this partnership project in their own time.
