Our Curriculum

There are 8 subjects within Curriculum for Excellence. Every session we aim to refresh at least one of these. This involves improving planning, introducing new resources and implementing changes. The table below shows the areas we have developed over the past 8 sessions. The name of the subject area does not always fully explain the extent of the content. For example: Literacy and English includes Reading, Writing and Listening & Talking. Expressive Arts includes Music, Art & Design, Dance and Drama. We have achieved a lot over the past number of years, but curriculum refreshment is an ongoing process.

As you can see, Religious and Moral Education (RME) still requires an update. Later this session, there will be a consultation with both children and parents/carers about our next steps.
